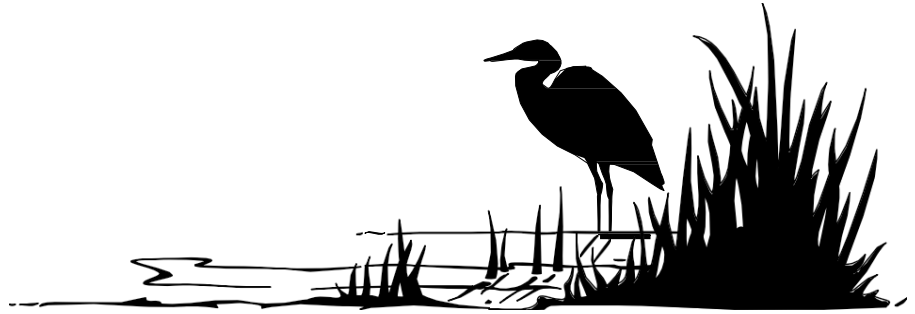

Progress report on GG#1640954 Santa Eulalia Safe Water Project

I am happy to report that the mid-point Progress Report was accepted and the Water Mission team and community members are hard at work with the goal of finishing Phase 1 as soon as possible.

We hope to have it completed or almost completed when the Cadre Review Team arrives there in July.

We celebrated a great success while we were there as the final coupling was placed on the pipes and water started flowing through the chlorination apparatus housed in its new building. Now 1138 families have easy access to safe water. We have another 700 to go in Phase 2. This system is pumping 33,000 gallons per day now. That equates to approximately 30 gallons per family.

Even more intriguing is that due to efficiencies, it does not cost a penny more to run.

We were delighted to see at the entrance to the town the attached banners we had requested in order to honor you and your clubs and your Districts for your very generous contributions. Please celebrate with us the success we have had so far. And please join us again when we are ready to get underway with Phase 2 very shortly.

No Meeting on 3rd of July however Naples Bay Rotary will be in the parade, Wednesday July 4 2018, which will start moving at 10:00 am that day. As usual, we'll decorate our "float" at Joel Miller's place, probably starting around 8:00 am. We'll leave Joel's around 9:00-9:15 am, and probably be positioned near St Ann's Church on south 3rd street around 9:30 in preparation for the 10:00 am parade starting.



On June 6th Roger attended a ceremony for Habitat for Humanities and Rotary. Roger said "My visit to the Rotary Club of Bonita Springs was a wonderful experience. The area clubs gave 50k to Habitat to Humanities for Lee and Hebert Counties. I stepped in for Tom." Rotary teamed up with Habitat for Humanities to rebuild homes that Rotary had already helped clean out and demo after Hurricane Irma. Habitat is known to build new affordable homes for qualified individuals that can't afford or qualify for a home without help. In this case, Habitat teamed up with

Rotary and other charity organizations in the area to help rebuild homes. This was a pilot program designed to help under insured individuals that didn't have the funds to rebuild their homes. Habitat for Humanity as set up a new "arm" of their organization and agreed to go into these homes and rebuild for between \$7K to \$10K and will give the home owners vouchers that can be used at their stores to help them replace appliances and other items that were lost.

On June 5th Zach Schleimer from Lord Abbett discussed market update & opportunities. Zack has been with Lord Abbot for over 7 years and came over from Miami to speak to our club.

Zach shared that when considering bonds, investors would avoid treasure bonds with low interest rates de to the threat of rising rates. He said that we should expect our economy to continue to expand and that means your investments will be caught up in low interest rate bonds when you could be making more money elsewhere in the market. Another bond to avoid is Long-term High-quality corporate bonds. These bonds take longer to mature and are more volatile to interest rates.

Bonds that are considered good opportunities might be Short-Term High-Quality corporate Bonds. These bonds are 1 to 3 years and protect you from Rising Interest delivering a return of 1 to 4%. Floating Rate Loans are also an opportunity, they have existed for 26 years and have delivered positive returns for 24 out of those 26 years. High Yield Bonds capture 85% of stock markets upside and give you high possibility of a return with low risk. Tax free bonds for state or local revenue have been increasing. They have been upgraded (from a credit worthy standing) twice as many times as they have been downgraded due to low supply and high demand.

As for the Stock Market you should avoid R.U.S.T. Real-estate, Utilities, Staples and Telecoms. For investors that have had investments in these sectors, they have lost 50% of their investments two times in the last 10 years. A good place to invest... Facebook! Facebook has over a billion members, the only other groups that can make that claim are China, India, and the Catholic Church.
