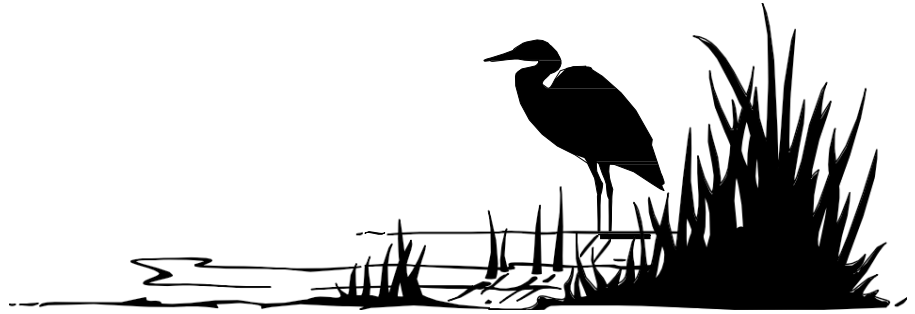

No Meeting on 3rd of July however Naples Bay Rotary will be in the parade, Wednesday July 4 2018, which will start moving at 10:00 am that day. As usual, we'll decorate our "float" at Joel Miller's place, probably starting around 8:00 am. We'll leave Joel's around 9:00-9:15 am, and probably be positioned near St Ann's Church on south 3rd street around 9:30 in preparation for the 10:00 am parade starting.



On June 19th we heard from our last financial speaker in June's Financial speakers series. Jared Motzenbecher visited us from Sarasota, Jared is with MFS (Massachusetts Financial Services) and discussed Market Insights. MFS has been in business for over 90 years. Jared shared that one of the strengths of the company is that they have employees that are local and understand the local market place. They don't just have investors sitting in a corporate office making all of the investing decisions.

What is happening in the market place here in the USA?

- We are in month 109 of a bull market, the longest run of a bull market in history was 110 months. There is a pending infrastructure bill that is expected to pass that will keep the bull market going.
- We are expecting 2 more rate hikes between now and the end of the year. Based on the most recent rate hike not causing any waves in the market place, it is believed that the next 2 hikes also won't affect the market.

5 Areas of Opportunity

- On Line Retail
 - There is 17 Trillion dollars of commerce, currently only 9% of that is in the online marketplace. This number is growing at 30% a year. It is expected then that the market share will double every 3 years. By 2021, 3 Trillion dollars of commerce will be online. The largest of course is Amazon. But most surprising in the online market place is online gamers. This demographic is made up of 13 to 45 years of age and spends an average of 3.5 hours a day watching someone else play a video game. The more people watching an individual, the more "hits" to their website, the more sponsors are willing to pay the gamer for playing. This area of online comers has a growth rate of 42%! - On Line Media
- Health Care
 - There is no combination of Public or Private insurance that will ever cover all healthcare costs. Individuals will always have to pay something out of pocket. This is a continually growing business with high potential to investors.
- Technology
 - Servers used to cost millions of dollars and required very large spaces, in some cases huge warehouses to store the servers. These were extremely costly because they also had to be kept cold for all the equipment. Recently there was a bid on a project that went out that required an enormous amount of computer power to complete. There were several bids of over \$1million and estimates of time that would require multiple months to complete. One company (google I believe, sorry I didn't write it down!) came back and said it would cost less than \$5K and could be done over a weekend... this was because of the computer power that this company possesses! WOW
- Industrials and Energy

What's happening in the World Market?

There has been a lot of talk about trade war and tariffs. In all likely hood, this is simply a negotiations play. In a book that President Trump wrote in 1987 he said that when negotiating "you should always make the most extreme play and let the others come to you to negotiate." It is believed that this is what Trump is doing in negotiations with China, Mexico, Canada and other countries.

OIL – Oil prices are rising again, and now the USA is the 2nd largest exporter in the world of oil and #1 in natural gas. Duke Energy and Entergy have the ships to export to Europe effectively replacing the pipelines that Russia has used to import into Europe.

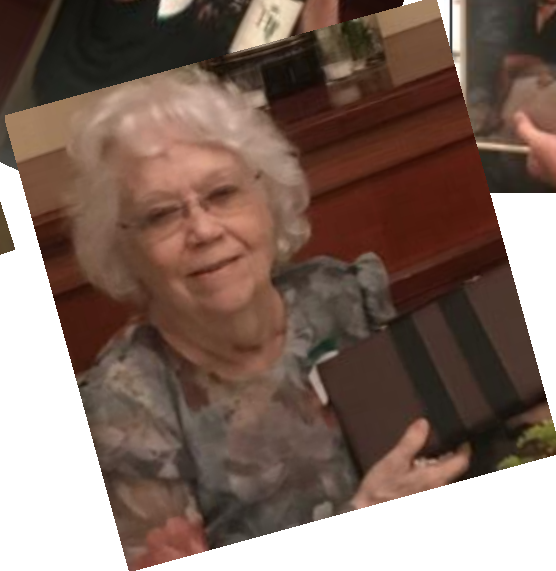
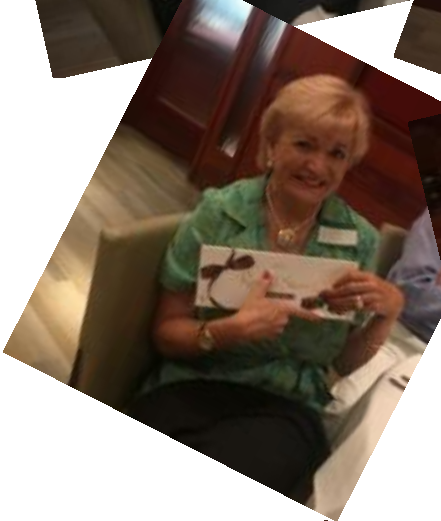
Shell built a pipeline that was to be used to import oil and before it began operations it was turned the other way and is being used to export oil instead of import oil.

Recognition

Each member has the opportunity to have his or her portrait placed in the Arch Klumph Society Gallery, located on the 17th floor of Rotary International World Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, USA. Portraits are etched on glass plaques, which are back-lit to create a stunning display of our Foundation's most valued supporters.

Induction

Society members can choose to be inducted in one of several ways: at a special

two-day ceremony at Rotary International World Headquarters, with other inductees; at a ceremony planned with local Rotary leaders during a Rotary institute; at a dinner prior to Rotary International Assembly; or at a special dinner during the Rotary International Convention.

History of the Arch Klumph Society

Arch C. Klumph founded the Rotary Club of Cleveland, Ohio, USA, in 1911 and was the 1916-17 Rotary president. Addressing the 1917 convention in Atlanta, Georgia, he eloquently promoted the idea of "endowments for the purpose of doing good in the world."

That year, the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, made the first gift, of \$26.50, to the fledgling fund. When the endowment had grown significant enough to require administrators to manage it, The Rotary Foundation was born, and Klumph was selected as one of its first trustees.

The Arch Klumph Society was created in 2004, during Rotary International's centennial celebration, as a meaningful way to recognize the Foundation's highest-level donors. The society's first dinner was held the following year. Today, members' portraits, engraved in glass plaques, hang in the Arch Klumph Society Gallery at Rotary International World Headquarters.
