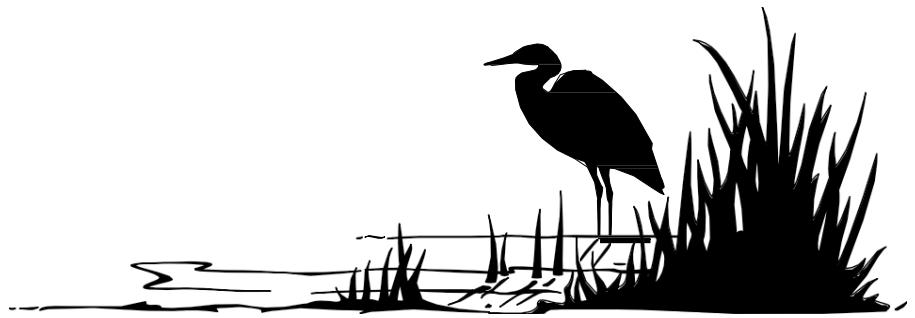

A long-time member of the Rotary Club of Naples, Dr. Phil Regala, an orthopedic surgeon, travels to Haiti once or twice a year on a medical mission. As a surgeon who tries to repair broken bones, he knows first-hand the need for wheelchairs throughout Haiti. He personally committed \$1,000 toward a container of wheelchairs (110) and The Rotary Club of Naples committed an additional \$2,000. We need to raise another \$8,000 for a total of \$11,000 per container.

With the help of District Chair Steve Agius, the Rotary Club of Naples is holding a fun social and fundraising event for Rotarians and their friends. In addition to raising money to ship a container of wheelchairs to Haiti, we may even interest others in the community to learn more about Rotary and how to become a member. Tim Miller spoke to us during our July 24th meeting. He shared his personal history as well as a history of the club and Naples.

He arrived in Naples in 1959 and started in a brand new elementary school called Shadowlawn. In September of 1960, Naples was hit by Hurricane Donna and his home, school and half of the town was destroyed or under flood waters. In the next few years with the help of FEMA monies, there were major changes in Naples as they began to rebuild. WNOG radio which stood for Wonderful Neighbor On the Gulf provided local news everyday and a Gal about town Lynn Bailey (Dr. Bailey's Wife) gave social activity reports. Shops on third street were closed for the summer and their owners went back north to their other markets such as Nantucket, Martha's Vineyards and every Petoskey, MI where they ran shops up there during the season up north. WGNO moved to a small two-lane road now called Radio Road near Naples Airport. Even the local airlines PBA (Providence Boston Airlines) sent half of its fleet to Massachusetts in the summer.

Radio Road was about the only access road to a new community called Golden Gate. Suckers (Seniors) were flown in from NJ, NY and the Northeast to buy properties that they only saw when flying over it. Sadly, many purchased properties that were prone to flooding. A Local realtor added the slogan "Walk on it before you buy it" to his advertisement to build his credibility. Downtown Naples had a working trainyard and even a passenger station.

Tim remembers his High School band taking the train to Washington DC to march in the Cherry Blossom Festival and shared that it was "pretty cool but very cold."

The who's who of Naples met for lunch at St. George and the Dragon, or a little further west on Fifth Avenue at the Piccadilly Pub. Both has the famous hot brown sandwich, which was a favorite of Barron Collier and originated in Louisville TN. Bob Moates was known to frequent many of the other fine eating and drinking establishments though out the community. Places like Rocco's steak House, The Italian Kitchen, The Flame Lounge, Swamp Buggy Lounge, The Anchor, Witches Brew, Pippins, the Pewter Mug (which is only just now moving to a new location) and Tropics restaurant. There was an old hotel down by Naples Pier, much the same spot where they are talking about building a new boutique hotel at the Plaza off third street. Near where the old library was, the beach store had the best fountain in town, and there was the Movie Theatre. The Movie theatre was an old Quonset hut and when it rained you couldn't hear the movie and it had a smoking section in the balcony area. Another old restaurant in town was Kelly's fish house dinning room which as far as Tim knows is now the oldest operating family owned restaurant in town. It is owned by the Combs family. Dennis and his family were early pioneers of the area and still have the fish house and marina where Kelly's is located. Many of the old marinas have disappeared, like the Old Evinrude testing center, Boat Haven where Naples Bay Resort now wits. The marina at Crayton cove, Marco River Marina North where Aqua Condominiums are located, and many other little marinas have fallen to development.

Many things have changed for the better. We now have 7 public high Schools and three private or parochial High Schools. In 50 years of living in Naples, he has seen vast improvements to our school system, our healthcare system and even our sheriff office and public services have expanded.



Moving on to a little history about Rotary Club of Naples Bay. The club was chartered in 1973 and unfortunately none of the charter members are remaining. Tim thinks both Bill Jones and Dennis Combs have been members longer than he has. Tim joined the then Naples East Rotary Club in 1975. The club was meeting at the Glades country Club in East Naples then. There were about 25 members and it was the third club in Naples. The club had to move locations to the Elks Club after a fire and stayed there for a few years. The club moved to LaVersailles restaurant on Naples Bay until it changed hands and then closed. The big fundraiser that year was a golf tournament at Windstar Country Club, and the club raised \$13,000 for Polio Plus. Then the club moved back to the Elks Club until it too burned down. Then the club moved to Naples Bath and Tennis Club. Ruth Ruskin became our President and that is when the club participated more in Rotary international than ever before. Under Ruth's direction the club purchased a shelter box (for emergency survival) had an exchange student named Laura for a year, sponsored a *Gift Of Life* child and partnered with a rotary club in Jamaica to build a fence for a women's shelter.

Naples Bath and Tennis suddenly closed, and the club went to Naples Bay at Joe's Crab Shack. The club then changed its name to Naples Bay hoping to free itself

geographically. When Joe's Crab Shack closed, the club moved back to the Elks club. There the club had a couple of fund raising roasts honoring Sheriff Don Hunter and others. Rotary life seemed good for a few years until the Elks Club property was purchased by the county for the Tax Appraiser's office. It was then that the club moved to Perkins on Pine Ridge where it seems to have a pretty happy home. Let's hope nothing happens here to cause us to move until we are ready to do so.

Tim didn't have the time to tell of the fun things the club has done over the years, but a few of them were softball games against other clubs, some crazy tie at district assemblies both in and out of town (mostly when we had a portable bar and always had a hospitality room) participating in hundreds of projects over the years. These projects have included shoes, toothbrushes, candy, parades, socials, cookouts, Christmas parties, a club exchange to Grand Cayman Island and International friendship visits to England with a seasonal member.



Later that evening was our club social at Noodles Restaurant. We had fun! If you couldn't attend you should make the effort in the future to come hang out and get to know your fellow Rotarians.
